



Trump Leads by Four with Likely Florida Voters on Eve of Election Day

November 2, 2020

For Immediate Release:

With the election tomorrow; according to Inweekly/Listener Group/Political Matrix study of 966 likely Florida voters, Donald Trump has reclaimed a lead, albeit narrow, over Joe Biden 48.0% to 44.2% with only 7.8% being undecided. The African American support has surged to 38% in support of Trump. The majority of the age demographics are fairly tight as well. Additionally, it looks as though the undecided in this race are the highest of any of the last several polls. Our position to this is that if you are still, at this moment, really undecided, then the likelihood of their participating in the election tomorrow might be remote. METHODOLOGY:

The cross tabs for this study are age, race, gender and party affiliation. The persons sampled were Florida likely voters with a voting score of 100% for the general election cycles. The voters called were those only with landlines and were called using an Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system and were called during the hours of 1PM to 8PM on November 2, 2020. The Margin of Error for this study is +/- 3.5% with a confidence level of 95%. Please see details on the following pages.
